


Excursion Details


Park City Mountain Resort - Summer activities at Park City Mountain Resort include the Alpine Pass which includes unlimited use of all activities and one-time use of Zip Lines. Additional Zip-Line Tickets can be purchased for \$5. Pass Activities include Alpine Slide, Alpine Coaster, Hiking, Scenic Lift Rides, Legacy Launcher, Adventure Zone, Little Miners Park, Climbing Wall and Miniature Golf.



Park City Historic Walking Tour - Put on your walking shoes and explore Park City's Historic Main Street! Explore the architecture and stories of Park City's unique history—from the days as a booming mine town to an emerging ski town. The tour is most appropriate for ages 13 and up. Please arrive 10 minutes early, wear comfortable walking shoes, bring water and wear sun protection. The tour lasts about one hour and will begin at the Park City Museum.



Each year Main Street takes center stage during the Sundance Film Festival with its star-studded lineup.
