By The Commission:

THIS MATTER is before the Commission on the petitioner's, ROCKY MOUNTAIN POWER (Company), petition to terminate service for RICHARD D. AND JAMIE BEVILHYMER (Respondents). No hearing was held in this matter. On February 17, 2010, the Division of Public Utilities (Division) sent a certified letter to the respondents informing them that they have until February 27, 2010 to file a protest or request a hearing with the Commission. On March 18, 2010 the respondents entered into a payment plan to satisfy the arrearage. The total balance at set-up is \$395.16. The respondents have agreed to pay the balance off in twenty four payments. The plan includes a down payment of \$200.00 with a minimum of \$8.00 plus the current bill due each month until the balance is satisfied. The Company also seeks leave to terminate the respondents' service if they fail to abide by the terms of the payment agreement.

Therefore, based upon the foregoing information, and for good cause appearing, the Commission orders as follows:

1. The respondents shall pay to the Company a down payment of \$200.00 with the minimum of \$8.00 a month plus current bill for a period of twenty four months until the arrearage is satisfied;
2. The Company shall waive interest owing on the arrearage so long as the respondents abide by the terms of this Report and Order.

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3. If the respondents fail to comply with the terms of the payment plan and this Report and Order, the Company shall have the right to disconnect services to respondents' residence in accordance with the Company regulations and tariff provisions and the applicable rules and regulations of the Commission. It shall not be required to seek further approval from the Commission for termination of service, notwithstanding the fact that a resident at respondents' residence may be using life-support equipment. In the event of termination, at least 48 hours prior to terminating said service, the Company shall notify the appropriate Utah state social service agencies of this Order and pending termination. The Company shall be free to pursue any other means of collection available to it under the law to collect any arrearages.
