ISSUED: March 23, 2011

By The Commission:

THIS MATTER is before the Commission on the petitioner's, ROCKY MOUNTAIN POWER (Company), petition to terminate service for WILLIAM E. GOODELL (Respondent). No hearing was held in this matter. On December 28, 2010, the Division of Public Utilities (Division) sent a certified letter to the respondent informing him that he had until January 10, 2011 to file a protest or request a hearing with the Commission. On January 3, 2011 the respondent entered into a payment plan to satisfy the arrearage. The total balance at set-up is \$1,376.10. The respondent has agreed to pay the balance off in twenty three equal payment installments of \$204.00, with \$54.00 going to the past due balance and \$150.00 going to the current charges until the balance is satisfied. The plan also includes a down payment of \$150.00. The Company also seeks leave to terminate the respondent's service if he fails to abide by the terms of the payment agreement.

Therefore, based upon the foregoing information, and for good cause appearing, the Commission orders as follows:

1. The respondent shall pay to the Company a down payment of \$150.00 with the minimum of \$204.00 a month for a period of twenty three months until the arrearage is satisfied;
2. The Company shall waive interest owing on the arrearage so long as the respondent abides by the terms of this Report and Order.

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3. If the respondent fails to comply with the terms of the payment plan and this Report and Order, the Company shall have the right to disconnect services to respondent's residence in accordance with the Company regulations and tariff provisions and the applicable rules and regulations of the Commission. It shall not be required to seek further approval from the Commission for termination of service, notwithstanding the fact that a resident at respondent's residence may be using life-support equipment. In the event of termination, at least 48 hours prior to terminating said service, the Company shall notify the appropriate Utah state social service agencies of this Order and pending termination. The Company shall be free to pursue any other means of collection available to it under the law to collect any arrearages.
